Wood carving is considered one of the oldest arts of humanity.

- North American Indians use it for their wooden fishhooks, and Polynesians carve patterns on their wooden paddles.
- The Clacton Spear is a 400,000-year-old spearhead and is the oldest known wooden device used.
- Where Timber was present, wood existed as the primary medium to create art and improve tech-
- Figure-work on wood was considered more difficult than sculpting marble. Wood cracks easily and is prone to other environmental factors. But it was still considered a significant medium resulting in magnificent pieces.
- The Shigir Idol is the oldest known wooden sculpture and was discovered in Russia. Said to be at least 11,000 years old, this sculpture remains a mystery to this day.

Magnificent wooden sculptures were created during Germany's late Gothic era, as evidenced in pieces, like the St. Wolfgang Altarpiece.

We had a great time making diamond willow walking sticks at our last carving session. We were pleased to have Sharein Berninghaus supply us with a truck box full of diamond willow sticks that she and her husband cut for us. She did not know what they were until she talked to Sonya. Sharein, graciously, did not want to except any reimbursement. Because of her generosity, everyone was able to work on more than one.
